A few weeks back, some teachers sent notices to parents inviting them to create a **Parent Seesaw Account** - with such an account, parents can see their child's work, assignments, portfolio entries, and teacher feedback for all of their child's Seesaw classes. As of today, we have 248 parents connected to Nottingham Seesaw accounts! Later today, Mr. Crouse will be sending an email to all families who have not yet signed up for a parent access account. In the email will be a unique link for your child so that you can directly create your account. Please do not share your link as it is assigned specifically to your child. There is no obligation for you to create an account, but we want to ensure that you are aware of the opportunity.

Lastly, here is a <u>video</u> showing how you and your child can see student feedback in a Seesaw account. You can also see this feedback when you are logged into your parent Seesaw account.

There are three (3) updates and changes that you should make to your child's APS iPad **today** to ensure the best device performance and learning in our virtual world.

The critical steps are below and also documented in this video:

Updating the iPad OS (to version 14+)

- ► this is the first step when the video starts
 - Be sure you plug in the iPad to the charger and leave it connected to power through the update process
 - Remember after the update downloads and verifies, you will have to click "install now" to force the update to occur
 - If the update fails and displays a message that there is not enough storage on the device, please work with your child to <u>remove any accumulated photos</u> and videos

Enabling Graphics in the Canvas Student App

Central IT will be pushing an Apple iPad iOS update to all student iPads at Nottingham. This update will take the operating system to version 13.7. There are a few things to keep in mind as you help your child with the update:

- It may take a few days for all devices to get the notice to update.
- The device must have at least 50% power to perform the software update.
- The update when downloaded will sit in the options under Settings > General > Software Update and await your permission to update manually.
- So long as the device is connected to power overnight, the update will auto-install and not require any intervention on your part.
- If the update fails, you may need to help your child remove any excess photos and videos from the device to create more storage for the installation.

Reminders

We know how much people love their pets and walks throughout the neighborhood. However, we've noticed that some of our friends and neighbors are bringing **pets on campus, which is against school board policy**. Sadly, we've also seen an uptick in evidence (ahem) left behind. With some of our students returning to school, we don't want them stepping in anything. Please help us by keeping pets off campus.

With more cars coming in and out of the parking lot, please remind your Knight to be **VERY careful when riding bikes, using scooters and walking**. We noticed a few students today who breezed through the intersection at N. Ohio and Little Falls without looking! Scary.

Report cards were issued November 20 via ParentVue. Nottingham uses standards-based reporting. If you are new to Nottingham, please refer to this parent guide for more information on standards-based reporting and how we report progress. This quarter, you may see more "insufficient evidence" for two possible reasons. First, it may mean that the teacher has not sufficiently covered the standard yet but continues to work on it with the class. This will be communicated through class newsletters or through the comments section on the report card. Second, a teacher will use "insufficient evidence" if the student has not demonstrated consistent performance. If it's the latter, your child's teacher either shared that with you already or will note it through comments.

The application process for **option schools and programs for middle and high school students opened this week**. Families interested in applying for a secondary option school or program can apply through the **online application portal**. Families can submit their application anytime during the application window. If families need assistance with completing applications, they should contact the APS Welcome Center at 703-228-8000 or **schooloptions@apsva.us**. Additional information and important dates, as well as links to watch the Middle and High School Information Night recordings, are **available online**.

Teachers will take attendance each day. As a reminder, we begin each day at 9:00 AM and conclude at 2:20 PM. Additionally, you are encouraged to email our Attendance Line (attendance.ntm@groups.apsva.us) when an absence is unexpected and prearranged notification was not possible. The following are generally considered excused absences: illness, quarantine of student, doctor or dentist appointments, death in the family, observance of a religious holiday, court appointments, inclement weather emergencies, connection issues while in virtual learning, and severe family emergencies. We need to note other absences as unexcused. Finally, we will contact families when a student has two absences or when absences, tardiness and early departures begin to accumulate.
