If you're interested in learning about the **boundary process** the adjusted boundary recommendation will be presented at the start of the **Public Hearing tonight (12/1) at 7:30 p.m.** Additional details, including information about interpretation services at the public hearing is <u>available online</u>. The public hearing can be <u>viewed live online</u> and on Comcast Cable Channel 70 and Verizon FIOS Channel 41. The School Board will take action on Thu., Dec. 3, on elementary school boundaries for the 2021-22 school year. The Virtual School Board meeting will begin at 7 p.m. and can be <u>viewed live online</u> and on Comcast Xfinity Cable Channel 70 and Verizon FiOS Channel 41. A few weeks back, some teachers sent notices to parents inviting them to create a **Parent Seesaw Account** - with such an account, parents can see their child's work, assignments, portfolio entries, and teacher feedback for all of their child's Seesaw classes. Last week, Mr. Crouse sent an email to all families who have not yet signed up for a parent access account. In the email will be a unique link for your child so that you can directly create your account. Please do not share your link as it is assigned specifically to your child. There is no obligation for you to create an account, but we want to ensure that you are aware of the opportunity.

Here is a <u>video</u> showing how you and your child can see student feedback in a Seesaw account. You can also see this feedback when you are logged into your parent Seesaw account.

Teachers will take attendance each day. As a reminder, we begin each day at 9:00 AM and conclude at 2:20 PM. Additionally, you are encouraged to email our Attendance Line (attendance.ntm@groups.apsva.us) when an absence is unexpected and prearranged notification was not possible. The following are generally considered excused absences: illness, quarantine of student, doctor or dentist appointments, death in the family, observance of a religious holiday, court appointments, inclement weather emergencies, connection issues while in virtual learning, and severe family emergencies. We need to note other absences as unexcused. Finally, we will contact families when a student has two absences or when absences, tardiness and early departures begin to accumulate.
