I know I just communicated with you the other day, but I wanted to provide some additional information with you with regards to future distance learning and to share some of my thoughts on some other things. I wanted you to know that I share your concerns about the many things we do each year under normal circumstances when we are fully operational. I want you to know, however, that we as a staff continue to plan relative to next year's classroom groupings, providing orientation opportunities for families, and sharing our regular staffing updates. We are considering new and creative ways to these things and to honor our students when we move closer to the regular conclusion of this school year, particularly our 5th graders, prior to their transition from Nottingham to middle school.

APS's Department of Teaching and Learning will send you an communication on the **continuous learning plan the week of April 6**. I need to commend the staff for all they have done until this point relative to pushing out instructional materials and activities, including our special education teachers and related services providers who are continuing to check in with families. Finally, please visit the VDOE website's **FAQ questions page** for more information on related topics of interest during this difficult time.

Relative to next year's **APS and Arlington County budget**, adjustments will need to be made given the loss of income for these entities in many areas. I am uncertain on how this situation will impact Nottingham specifically.

I will continue to update you, at least weekly, with information that becomes available. Please continue to reach out, be in touch and let us know how we can support you and your children.
