We extend a very special thank you to **Andrea Lindquist Kaplowitz** and family for planting a tree in honor of our 5th graders. Stay tuned for more ways we plan to honor them all before they head off to middle school.

Last week the school board approved a school year-end date of June 12. As for next year, APS is planning for three possible scenarios to start the fall: Starting the school year with distance learning, should public health officials advise us it is

not safe to reopen. Based on current conditions, this is a likely scenario, and we are preparing for a distance learning model that includes synchronous instruction of new content; reopening schools with a hybrid of in-person and online instruction, including multiple contingencies to meet class size limits and social distancing requirements; and, reopening schools as normal with in-person instruction, if social distancing requirements have been lifted and conditions are met to open school buildings safely. Based on current conditions, this is the least likely scenario. More information will follow on these possibilities. A team of staff work collaboratively to ensure the proper classroom placement for each student based on numerous academic and social emotional factors. Please refrain from making specific teacher requests and thank you for your trust as we work through the details.

APS will provide summer learning programs and resources via distance learning this summer. Summer distance learning will begin July 20 and conclude on August 14. APS will provide an online secondary summer strengthening program and selected new work social studies classes for students in grades 6-12. APS will provide every elementary student who was identified for summer school prior to the closure with access to online resources and school-based instructional and social-emotional support. Here are some resources that will hopefully help with talking to children about how to cope after a disaster as well as some fun activities to do at home.

 - Enjoy story time Oliver Jeffers reads one of his stories each day on his Instagram. <u>StoryLine Online</u> is offering children's books read by famous celebrities.
- Place emphasis on self-care for kids and parents

Make sure Arlington gets the funding and critical resources it needs to thrive day-to-day, by **getting counted in the 2020 Census**. Arlington County currently has only a 66.5% response rate, so we still have work to do. In light of the COVID-19 outbreak, the Census Bureau has extended the response deadline until Oct. 31. Watch this video to learn more.

Each week APS is broadcasting K-2 lessons called <u>"At Home with APS"</u> which include Social Emotional Learning, as well. These lessons can be watched on Comcast Xfinity Channel 70/1090 and Verizon FiOS Channel 41. They will air **Monday through Friday from 10-10:30, 2-2:30, 5-5:30, and 7-7:30**.

VA TV Classroom will air "Learn to Grow with WHRO" for students in grades K-2. They will broadcast on WETA PBS kids via antenna 26.3, Comcast 266, Cox 801, Verizon FiOS 472, and RCN 38 each day from 1 to 2.

At last week's School Board meeting, APS announced a proposed modification to the end of year calendar for 2019-20, **ending instruction on June 12**. APS also outlined contingency plans for Summer School which vary based on multiple factors, including

guidance from state officials and social distancing requirements. For more information and the new end-of-year dates and summer school plans, <u>visit the APS website</u>.

On April 15, the School Board launched a **new public comment process** to seek feedback from the community on policy drafts and revisions. Staff will review comments and any suggestions submitted during the comment period before completing and presenting the final draft as an information item to the School Board.
