<u>ODYSSEY OF THE MIND</u> is an international educational program that provides creative problem-solving opportunities for students from kindergarten through college. Teams of 5-7

students apply their creativity and work together to solve problems that range from building mechanical devices to presenting their own interpretation of literary classics. They then bring their "solutions" (devices and performances) to competition at the regional, state, and world level. Team members must generate all ideas and carry out those ideas themselves without parental help.

Kids of all ages are invited! This year students get to choose from problems that take them into the world of museums, robotics, and Leonardo da Vinci, among others. It is not a huge time commitment, and it is completely free this year!
