Announcements, Reminders and Updates

September 11...Each year, at 9:37 a.m. (the time of the attack on the Pentagon), the Arlington community observes a moment of silence in remembrance of the events of 9/11.Today marked the 17^{th} anniversary of the terrorist attacks. Today we used our moment of silence to honor those affected by this tragedy. For the remainder of the week you'll notice our "Freedom Flag" on the flagpole in remembrance. Students heard this message this morning.

Emergency Drill Reminder...During the month of September, we will have six drills; a fire drill each week and two lockdown drills. Your child(ren) will be taught what to do in the unlikely event of either emergency.

Allergy alert...Please be mindful when packing snacks that several classrooms are allergy safe. Students with significant food allergies can be seriously impacted if they consume, touch or breathe certain allergens. We appreciate everyone being cautious and careful when packing snacks for the classroom.

A note from Ryan Van Valen, Resource Teacher for the Gifted... At Nottingham, we take a holistic approach when identifying students for gifted services. We look at work samples, ability test scores, and teacher observations as a committee. If your child is found eligible or has already been identified for gifted services, we will be using resources aimed at gifted learners with him/her throughout the year, as well as with other learners as needed. Gifted services are provided by me, the homeroom teacher, with planning help from the RTG, Ms. Van Valen. We extend the curriculum so students have the opportunity to think abstractly, work on tasks with various levels of complexity, and pursue tasks of interest independently. If interested, join Ms. Van Valen for a Gifted Services Overview Presentation on Friday, October 5th from 9:00-9:45am in the library.

A Note on Attendance... We encourage everyone to be at school on time each day. As a reminder, we begin each day at 9:00 AM and conclude at 3:41 PM. The following are generally considered excused absences: illness, quarantine of student, doctor or dentist appointments, death in the family, observance of a religious holiday, court appointments, inclement weather emergencies, and severe family emergencies. We need to note other absences as unexcused. Finally, we will send a letter home when absences or tardies and early departures begin to accumulate.

If your child does need to miss school, please email the homeroom teacher and the main office attendance email (attendance.ntm@groups.apsva.us). Teachers will work with students to make

up any missed assignments. If there is a **last-minute change for pick-up**, **please call** the main office at 703-228-5290 as emailing the teacher may not get the message to your child in time.

Did you know that October is Bully Prevention Month? Throughout the month, our counselors, Mark Jones and Kelynne Bisbee will work with teachers to instruct students on several aspects of bullying. Nottingham students are taught to recognize bullying behavior and provide strategies for dealing with it, including assertively saying "no" and reporting to an adult. Personalized Learning iPad Device Information

GRADES K, 1, 2:

- This week, each 1st and 2nd grade classroom will be getting a set of iPads that is a ratio of 2 students to each device. These devices will stay at school overnight and be shared by all students.
- Grade K classrooms should get their allocated devices later in the year, likely mid-October.
- Students will initial/sign a classroom poster this year in the classroom that discusses some of the basic points of the APS Acceptable Use Policies.
- APS is in the process of creating a list of apps that are available for student instruction and those will be posted soon on the APS Digital Devices central page.
- Digital Citizenship lessons will occur again this year at all grade levels and are conducted by our school librarian, in conjunction with Mr. Crouse, our instructional technology coordinator.

GRADES 3, 4, 5:

- Next week, each student in grades 3, 4 and 5 will be issued an APS provided Apple iPad that is individually assigned to them.
- iPads will only be assigned to students who have signed the APS Acceptable Use & Responsibility Agreement and also had their parents sign the same form.
- Just as we did last year, the devices can come home each academic day to be used as an extension of their learning.
- All classrooms will be provided with charging stations that will allow the devices to be charged at school when not used during the day. This will allow the devices to be charged to at least 40-50% before coming home each day. Therefore, charging cables and blocks will not be sent home this year.
- iPads are an extension tool for learning, just as a ruler, highlighter or book. There is no expectation for assignments to be completed on the iPad specifically. However, device use and integration may be suggested by teachers.

- Students are asked to follow your family's values when using devices you should decide and monitor how and when your device is used at home.
- APS is in the process of creating a list of apps that are available for student instruction and those will be posted soon on the APS Digital Devices central page.
- Digital Citizenship lessons will occur again this year at all grade levels and are conducted by our school librarian, in conjunction with Mr. Crouse, our instructional technology coordinator.

Reminders...

- The Halloween Parade will be on Halloween! More details will be forthcoming once Halloween is closer, but since this is a BIG change, we wanted to alert you sooner rather than later.
- 4th and 5th grade is departmentalizing (switching classes) for content. Our students will be ready for middle school and all the transitions they will face in grade 6
- We will be spending a great deal of time experimenting and evaluating what works to build our exemplary project "STEAMing Ahead" and look forward to seeing where Kristin Muller, Exemplary Project Coordinator takes us.
- Recess is now 30 minutes at every grade level (more if they finish lunch a little early).
- Dismissal changes have been implemented and I apologize for not getting the information to you sooner. See below for specifics.

Reminder.. TOMORROW September 12 at 7:00PM is Back to School Night. This is the perfect opportunity for you to meet your child's teacher, if you haven't already, and to learn about the great things happening at Nottingham. First, you will view a short video from your principal and PTA President, Stacy Rosenthal. Parent-teacher conference sign-ups will also be available. There will be two sessions for parents to attend. Specials teachers and specialists will be in the library should you have any questions.

Finally, please join us for the PTA Meeting at 8:05AM for some important information and to establish plans for the year.

Reminder about arrival and dismissal....School begins at 9:00AM and students are welcome to arrive at about 8:40AM. Students should sit outside the classroom (MaryBeth Johnson's students should sit outside the art room near the back door). Students in grades 3 and 4 who have classrooms on the lower level can also sit outside classrooms with 2 exceptions. Ms. Ready's class should sit across from the library by Mr. Jones' counseling office. Students in Ms. Foeckler's class should sit outside the art room storage closet. Signs will be posted and staff will be available to assist. Breakfast will be served to any student who would like to have some.

We've adjusted the dismissal process to streamline and build student independence. You may have already received my note, but just in case...

• Walkers in grades K/1 will meet a parent or designee on the front blacktop.

- Walkers in grades 2-5 will dismiss through the door closest to their classroom or near a point of pickup that families have agreed upon.
- Bus riders will line up in the hallway or on the front steps to await arrival of the bus.
- Extended day students in K/1 will be escorted to Extended Day.
- Extended day students in grades 2-5 will be dismissed directly to Extended Day.

Reminder...Safety is of the upmost concern and children and families should obey and follow all posted signs, staff and crossing guards. If you are driving your child to school, please follow directions from Ms. Pugh, Mr. Giusto and the patrols for kiss and ride. Please make sure you are parking legally around the neighborhood if you plan to walk your child in to the building. At the end of the day, please be mindful of the parking signs and do not park illegally around the school. This presents safety hazards and confusion. Thanks for your cooperation on this.

Parent Coaches Needed – Girls on the Run

We are STILL in need of parent coaches able to regularly attend twice a week, before-school practices (Wed/Fri 7:45-8:50 am) for a ten week period (late Sept through early-Dec). Registration for coaches and participants runs through Monday, September 17. Please go to www.gotrnova.org to register.

Nottingham has a long standing tradition of active participation in GOTR. We have two community coaches from GOTR but need Nottingham volunteer coaches to ensure a successful season. Without additional coaches, we will likely be limited to only 20 participants selected by lottery. For the last three years, we have had 30-40 girls each season. That requires 6 coaches at a minimum and is most effectively managed with about 10 to allow the coaches some flexibility.
