<u>Reminder...</u>Allergy alert...Please be mindful when packing snacks that several classrooms are allergy safe. Students with significant food allergies can be seriously impacted if they consume, touch or breathe certain allergens. We appreciate everyone being cautious and careful when packing snacks for the classroom.

Reminder...A note from Ryan Van Valen, Resource Teacher for the Gifted...At Nottingham, we take a holistic approach when identifying students for gifted services. We look at work samples, ability test scores, and teacher observations as a committee. If your child is found eligible or has already been identified for gifted services, we will be using resources aimed at gifted learners with him/her throughout the year, as well as with other learners as needed. Gifted services are provided by me, the homeroom teacher, with planning help from the RTG, Ms. Van Valen. We extend the curriculum so students have the opportunity to think abstractly, work on tasks with various levels of complexity, and pursue tasks of interest independently. Reminder...A Note on Attendance...We encourage everyone to be at school on time each day. As a reminder, we begin each day at 9:00 AM and conclude at 3:41 PM. The following are generally considered excused absences: illness, quarantine of student, doctor or dentist appointments, death in the family, observance of a religious holiday, court appointments, inclement weather emergencies, and severe family emergencies. We need to note other absences as unexcused. Finally, we will send a letter home when absences or tardies and early departures begin to accumulate.

If your child does need to miss school, please email the homeroom teacher and the main office attendance email (attendance.ntm@groups.apsva.us). Teachers will work with students to make up any missed assignments. If there is a last-minute change for pick-up, please call the main office at 703-228-5290 as emailing the teacher may not get the message to your child in time.

Reminder...Did you know that October is Bully Prevention Month? Throughout the month, our counselors, Mark Jones and Kellynne Bisbee will work with teachers to instruct students on several aspects of bullying. Nottingham students are taught to recognize bullying behavior and provide strategies for dealing with it, including assertively saying "no" and reporting to an adult. Reminder...Personalized Learning iPad Device Information

GRADES K, 1, 2:

- This week, each 1st and 2nd grade classroom will be getting a set of iPads that is a ratio of 2 students to each device. These devices will stay at school overnight and be shared by all students.
- Grade K classrooms should get their allocated devices later in the year, likely mid-October.
- Students will initial/sign a classroom poster this year in the classroom that discusses some of the basic points of the APS Acceptable Use Policies.
- APS is in the process of creating a list of apps that are available for student instruction and those will be posted soon on the APS Digital Devices central page.
- Digital Citizenship lessons will occur again this year at all grade levels and are conducted by our school librarian, in conjunction with Mr. Crouse, our instructional technology coordinator.

GRADES 3, 4, 5:

- This week, each student in grades 3, 4 and 5 will be issued an APS provided Apple iPad that is individually assigned to them.
- iPads will only be assigned to students who have signed the APS Acceptable Use & Responsibility Agreement and also had their parents sign the same form.
- Just as we did last year, the devices can come home each academic day to be used as an extension of their learning.
- All classrooms will be provided with charging stations that will allow the devices to be charged at school when not used during the day. This will allow the devices to be charged to at least 40-50% before coming home each day. Therefore, charging cables and blocks will not be sent home this year.
- iPads are an extension tool for learning, just as a ruler, highlighter or book. There is no expectation for assignments to be completed on the iPad specifically. However, device use and integration may be suggested by teachers.
- Students are asked to follow your family's values when using devices you should decide and monitor how and when your device is used at home.
- APS is in the process of creating a list of apps that are available for student instruction and those will be posted soon on the APS Digital Devices central page.
- Digital Citizenship lessons will occur again this year at all grade levels and are conducted by our school librarian, in conjunction with Mr. Crouse, our instructional technology coordinator.

Reminder about arrival and dismissal....School begins at 9:00AM and students are welcome to arrive at about 8:40AM. Students should sit outside the classroom (MaryBeth Johnson's students should

sit outside the art room near the back door). Students in grades 3 and 4 who have classrooms on the lower level can also sit outside classrooms with 2 exceptions. Breakfast will be served to any student who would like to have some.

We've adjusted the dismissal process to streamline and build student independence. You may have already received my note, but just in case...

- Walkers in grades K/1 will meet a parent or designee on the front blacktop.
- Walkers in grades 2-5 will dismiss through the door closest to their classroom or near a point of pickup that families have agreed upon.
- Bus riders will line up in the hallway or on the front steps to await arrival of the bus.
- Extended day students in K/1 will be escorted to Extended Day.
- Extended day students in grades 2-5 will be dismissed directly to Extended Day.

Reminder...Safety is of the upmost concern and children and families should obey and follow all posted signs, staff and crossing guards. If you are driving your child to school, please follow directions from Ms. Pugh, Mr. Giusto and the patrols for kiss and ride. Please make sure you are parking legally around the neighborhood if you plan to walk your child in to the building. At the end of the day, please be mindful of the parking signs and do not park illegally around the school. This presents safety hazards and confusion. Thanks for your cooperation on this.
